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Real Funny... You can't lose something you never had to begin with!



Okay, Okay, let's give me credit where it's due. I've actually Come a long way as far as recognizing my neurodiversity goes.




Knowing how my brain works has afforded me great Clarity on what Works for me and what doesn't.


Now that I'm older, I find these old labels don't really suit or serve me anymore. Calling myself Stupid did what it needed to for a while, but now, it's holding me back.

But practicing Self Kindness is like riding a bike...




The point is, it gets easier the more I act on being patient and forgiving with my foolishness.
